Nursing Home Update

Environmental Awareness

St Louis is working to reduce its carbon footprint. We have for some years had solar panels fitted at our Dudley Road Home Care office, St Louis Nursing Home and St Louis on Blyth. We have begun changing our vehicle fleet to electric and hybrid vehicles. Jane Lindsay, St Louis' Social Programs Manager is currently driving our first hybrid vehicle, a Toyota Corolla.

St Louis Self-Assessment for Re-Accreditation

We are currently completing our self-assessment of the Nursing Home, as we are due for re-accreditation early next year in 2022 and the quality agency will be visiting anytime between now up until Christmas.

Electronic Check-in and Visting Hours

We have introduced an electronic check-in station to assist with checking you in. After you have checked in with this system, you can keep your label and use for visiting again next time.

Just a reminder that our visiting times are between 2.00pm to 4.30pm Monday to Friday - you are welcome to visit outside of this time but please ring and make a booking, in order to ensure we have staff available to check you in. Please also let friends and family know of these open visiting times.

Providing an Environment Free from Restrictive Practice

St Louis is committed to a providing an environment that is free from restrictive practice. Restrictive practice is defined as any practice or intention that has the effect of restricting the right of freedom of movement of the care recipient. There are 5 categories of restrictive practice – chemical, environmental, mechanical, physical and seclusion. We provide person centred, evidence based care to minimise the use of resistive practice. St Louis does not use physical restraint devices.

An example of what may be considered a restrictive practice are bed rails. There is now strong evidence that bed rails increase the risk of harm to residents, so we do not encourage bed rails be used by residents. Alternative fall prevention and harm minimisation strategies are now used across St Louis.

Master Plan 2024 – Nursing Home Maris Naish, CEO

Dear St Louis residents, clients, family and friends. I am excited to announce that the Department of Health from 1/7/2024 has deregulated nursing home bed licenses.

This means that we will be able to substantially expand St Louis nursing home located at 21 Foster Street Parkside. St Louis owns 5000 square metres of land adjacent the nursing home, obtained over a number of years for precisely this purpose.

The heart of the expansion will be the large 26 square metre rooms based on the new east wing constructed last year which evaluations and feedback have shown to be extremely popular.

St Louis community engagement and input will be integral to the design and features of the expanded St Louis nursing home.

Continuity of care for our home care clients wishing to continue their journey with St Louis if residential care or respite is required will also be a key feature of future planning.

St Louis is also very conscious of not wanting to lose the warmth and homely feel for which we are known, however additional scale is necessary to maintain viability. Draft master plans will be forwarded to the St Louis community for comment.

St Louis on Sea is currently operating at near capacity and demand and resident feedback has been outstanding. In response to this demand St Louis also has future expansion plans for this model in Adelaide and regional SA.

How to Provide Feedback or Make a Complaint

- Talk to the Director of Care, Clinical Nurse or Registered Nurse on duty; or
- Complete a feedback form available at the information brochure rack in the Atrium, and give it to a staff member or place it in the suggestion box, outside the clinical Nurses office.
- All feedback will be recorded and complaints followed up.
 If the issue you raise requires investigation, we will keep you informed and let you know when to expect a response.
